NZ Tour continues...

Waihi: We stopped off at Waihi on the way through to Hamilton. It was for just one meeting at a local college. This was well attended and the people were very grateful that Tony stopped off to share with them. Many people responded to the Gospel.

Hamilton: Our visit started with a Pastors and leaders meeting. Tony also spoke at about 10 meetings which included schools, Waikeria prison, a men's breakfast, churches and finally at the Regent Theatre which was packed with about 1500 people.

New Plymouth: We only spent 2 days here but managed to pack plenty into it. Tony spoke at a number of schools, we took a leaders seminar at the Salvation Army and held a large outreach meeting with over 1000 people attending. I managed to get helpers to help hand out tracts after the meeting.

Palmerston North: We had 4 days here and once again Tony was very busy with school visits and other meetings including a full house at the Regent Theatre (1500 approx). I spoke at the Pastors/leaders seminar and sold a good number of resources. We also distributed plenty of tracts and E-cards at the various meetings.

Napier/ Hastings: Tony spoke at more schools, a prison and at a large night meeting where hundreds of E-cards were given out. We also took a leaders seminar in the city.

Wellington: We spent 4 days here which included a visit by Tony to Rimutaka prison, a leaders seminar, men's breakfast, a number of school visits and a large youth meeting. Tony was also one of the main speakers at the Promise Keepers conference.
