NZ tour completed!

All Black encounter: After leaving the van at Invercargill airport we headed off to Auckland. Once we arrived at Auckland airport I noticed a couple of big guys hanging around in the arrivals area. On closer inspection I saw that they were All Blacks (Chris Jack and Jason Eaton). Not wanting to waste an opportunity I got a couple of 'The Test' tracts out of my pocket and went up to them. I gave a quick greeting then offered them the tracts by saying something like 'Have you guys done the Kiwi 'good' Test yet? If you're like me you'll fail miserably but there's good news at the end of it'. They took the tracts and I left them to browse through them in their own time. Please pray for those guys.

Promise Keepers:

Tony spoke twice at Promise Keepers with around 2500 people at the Friday night event. A large number of the men went forward for the altar call which was encouraging.

Church Services and Paremoremo prison:

Tony spoke at Harbourside Church on Sunday morning and Greenlane Christian centre in the evening. Both meetings were well attended and more people responded to the Gospel. Tony also had a great response from the inmates at Paremoremo prison when he visited.

Summary:

After almost 7 weeks away, 15 cities visited, more than 90 meetings and over 6000km covered in the van there was a sense of satisfaction and relief as we left Invercargill and headed back home to Auckland. Satisfaction that we had completed a very busy tour and done a good job and relief that we didn't have to pack up our gear into the trailer again and cart it to another city.

The tour was a great success with over 35,000 tracts and E-cards sold or distributed, dozens of training DVD's sold, thousands of Kiwi's hearing the Gospel at numerous meetings and through one on one encounters, hundreds of people responding to the Gospel and dozens of church leaders and Pastors challenged and encouraged with evangelism. It was also a great opportunity to connect with and encourage other evangelists around the country.

I'm excited about the future of the ministry as we have a number of exciting opportunities in the pipeline (more on this in the next newsletter).
