A lady in Northland describing how she led another lady to the Lord using the 'Are you on the right road' tract:

'She was sitting on the bench outside the post office waiting for the bus. Her name is Michelle she is 23. She used to go to Bible in Schools at Raurimu Primary School. When she looked at the tract she said, "Oh I'm not on the right road." So I invited her to read the booklet aloud. She did. I'd talked to her previously about Easter and why Jesus had died to find out what she actually knew. Then I went through some of the ten

commandments eg 'Have you ever told a lie?' I explained that God will only allow perfect people into heaven. I made sure she understood the consequences of her sin. I explained that if she was standing before a judge and had sinned or stolen something that she would have to be punished. I asked her to read the sinners prayer on the tract to herself so she knew what she was praying. When she'd read it through she said, "This is awesome!" I then asked her if she was sure she wanted to go through with it. I told her I didn't want to pressure her eg twist her arm up her back. She laughed. Then she prayed the prayer, confessing her sins from the list on the previous page. I then prayed with her. There was another lady – a Seventh Day Adventist who I knew – who came to sit on the bench. She used to evangelise in South Africa and has also taught Bible in Schools. So I left them talking together as they waited for the bus. I have her name and address and she may come to my home group tonight. Praise the Lord!!'

Oh yeah, Gill also said, "These tracts are so awesome!" or something to that effect after the conversation.
